News from Hillside by Bill Santos

The Columbia Association Board of Directors held a meeting on June 27, 2024. Major items addressed at the meeting:

Welcomed CA's new President, Shawn MacInnes, and the Kings Contrivance Columbia Council Representative, Paul Rader to the Board of Directors.

Strategic Plan

The Strategic Plan discussion was a holdover from the FY2024 Board of Directors. It was on the Board Agenda in May 2024 and was tabled so that the new President could review the material. At the outset of our discussion in June, a motion was made to table the topic once again. A vote was taken and the motion failed. After some discussion, the CA Board voted to establish a 6-month timeline to complete the Strategic Plan. In addition, the CA President committed to producing a schedule to meet the established timeline.

Easements in Downtown Columbia

The CA Board of Directors engaged in a conversation with representatives of the Howard Hughes Corporation related to three easements in the downtown Columbia/Merriweather District area. These three easements are interrelated and are tied to a contractual instrument that CA and Howard Hughes (through its subsidiary Howard Research and Development (HRD)) signed back in 2015.

This instrument is known as the Crescent Exchange Agreement, and it provides the following:

Howard Research and Development transfers 15.7 acres of open space land to the Columbia Association in exchange for 1.19 acres to build a pathway and a portion of Merriweather Drive.

Approximately 3.96 acres of the open space land would be placed in a perpetual conservation easement that would be monitored by the Maryland Department of the

Environment and maintained by Columbia Association.

During construction of buildings and other improvements adjacent to the 15.7 acres of open space, Howard Hughes and CA would coordinate the construction of small projects, such as retaining walls, stormwater management facilities, and utility pads in support of the development. After construction, Howard Hughes would enter into a perpetual agreement with CA that would grant access to Howard Hughes to these facilities to perform maintenance. This easement would be perpetual.

Since 2015, the above mentioned improvements have been constructed under the Crescent Exchange Agreement, but the easements have not been executed. These easements are scheduled to be voted during the CA Board meeting July 25, 2024.

Budget Schedule

CA staff provided a brief update on the upcoming budget schedule. Columbia Association will begin the FY2026 budget process in October 2024. As details emerge, I will send along updates via the Wilde Lake Village Board newsletter.

Strategic Relationship between the Villages and CA

The CA Board had an open-ended discussion about the relationship between the Columbia Association and the Columbia Villages. The discussion started with CA staff providing a background of the current CA and Village relationship. Although no conclusions were reached, it is clear that board members (and possibly villages) view the CA grant structure and rental policies are unequal from Village to Village. I believe there will be more discussion on this topic throughout this board year.
