




Umbrella Exhibit at Lakefest This Weekend



News from Hillside by Bill Santos

The CA Board of Directors held a meeting on Thursday May 23, 2024. There were two items on the agenda: the draft Strategic Plan held over from FY2024 and a proposed onboarding package offered by the executive search consultant firm.

On the subject of the draft Strategic Plan, the current CA Board quickly came into agreement that the incoming President/CEO Shawn MacInnes should review and provide

input into the Strategic Plan before any decision on content is made. A lively discussion followed on the purpose of the Strategic Plan. As part of the discussion a motion was made to state the purpose of the Strategic Plan. This motion was put forward to ensure that in all future discussions of the Strategic Plan, the entire board would be on the same page with respect to what the board wanted to accomplish. After some discussion of the motion, the wording of the motion was slightly changed and read as follows:

"Provide the staff goals, objectives, and guidance on what they should achieve, maintain, and change in CA over the next five years and provide an ability to track CA's progress towards the goals."

This motion passed.

The second agenda item was a discussion of an onboarding package for the incoming President. A motion was made to approve the onboarding package. During the discussion of the motion, staff indicated that the new President had expressed an interest in evaluating the package after he arrives in Columbia. The board then engaged in a robust discussion about the package offered. After some discussion, an observation was made that the board was united in wanting the oncoming President to look at the Strategic Plan before taking any further action, and that seeking Presidential input on the onboarding proposal would be consistent with that philosophy. At this point, the motion to approve the onboarding proposal was withdrawn.

Soon thereafter, the meeting was adjourned.

A brief note on Interim President Dennis Mattey

In just a few weeks, Dennis Mattey will hand the CA President position to Shawn MacInnes. As we move forward with new leadership this year, it is also important to recognize the lifetime of professional accomplishments of Dennis Mattey.

Dennis Mattey's career started in the early 1970's, and the May 23, 2024 CA Board meeting was the last CA Board meeting of his long and distinguished career. Dennis began as a lifeguard at CA pools and worked his way up through the Aquatics, moved on to Construction, became the Vice President and ultimately President of the Corporation.

In short, there are few CA facilities that Dennis hasn't either worked in or helped build. From Splashdown to Snowmageddon, Dennis was there. Not only from 9-to-5, but hundreds of Thursday nights, weekends, and special events. I have found him to be an incredible resource and a good person to work with. I am proud to call him my friend. This short note does not begin to honor the more than fifty-year career of a man that dedicated his professional life to making Columbia a great place to live. Dennis, thank you for your sweat, bravery, determination, and wisdom.


